AFFIDAVIT

Comes now the affiant, of lawful age, in support of a probable cause finding for the detention of the defendant or the issuance of an arrest warrant, states as follows:

- 1. On February 25, 2023, police were dispatched to Aspen's restaurant in Johnson County, Kansas, regarding a battery report. The reporting party advised that his son, had been shoved by the defendant, Jackson Mahomes, earlier in the evening.
- 2. When police arrived, they spoke with who told them that he had needed to retrieve his water bottle from the office on the lower level of the restaurant, which is a staff-only area. He found the door to the office locked and he entered the key code and was barely through the door when Jackson Mahomes pushed in the chest and told him he could not come in. told Jackson that he worked there and needed his water bottle. The defendant pushed again and told him to get out. was able to get his water bottle and leave. and were both in the office with the defendant when tried to get in.
- 3. Police interviewed and she said that the defendant extended an arm towards when he tried to come into the office but she could not remember if

physical contact was made or not. was also interviewed and she said no physical contact was made. It should be noted that there are surveillance cameras that captured the incident and the video is consistent with account.

- 4. a restaurant employee, was outside of the office during this incident and witnessed the defendant push
- 5. The defendant attempted to apologize later to but also told him that he shouldn't have to tell twice to leave a room and that if he is in a room in the restaurant, it is off limits. The defendant also told that he could call and would be going home.
- 6. While police were investigating the battery on they talked to the owner of the restaurant. She told the police that the defendant had been to her restaurant before and he was friends with her former step-daughter, indicated they had problems with the defendant before and had to kick him out previously.
- 7. told the police that the defendant had told her he needed to speak to her in the office. She went into the office and the defendant closed the door. He then grabbed her by the throat, forcing her head back and kissed her and put his tongue in her mouth.

did not consent to this and is over the age of 16. She pushed the defendant away. Approximately 30 seconds later, the defendant grabbed again by the throat and forced her head backwards and kissed her and put his tongue in her mouth. struggled with the defendant and pulled his hand off her waist and pushed him away. She did not consent. Seconds later, the defendant again grabbed her by the throat and forced her head back and kissed her without her consent. He told her not to tell anyone.

- 8.. told the police she tried to call out to two servers who were in the lower level work area, but they did not hear her. After the defendant left the office, she told them both what had happened and showed them her neck which had visible sign of injury that was fresh. Both servers confirmed this account with police.
- called her boyfriend to come to the restaurant and he arrived a few minutes later while the defendant was back in the office, attempting to explain to could do for her business. It should be noted that the defendant has a large social media following. was also in the office. At one point, tried to leave and told him to stay because she did not want to be alone with the defendant. boyfriend arrived at the restaurant and went into the office with the defendant and still there. He did not know that the defendant had forcefully kissed at that point. The defendant refused to leave until gave him a hug which she reluctantly did. Once told her boyfriend what had happened, he went upstairs and told the defendant and his group of friends to leave. The defendant was angry about this but did eventually leave with his friends.
