Students typically spend approximately 15 hours a week for one semester working in the news, sports, weather, promotions, production, or engineering departments. The students earn academic credit from their school and use the experience to help them obtain a job in broadcasting when they graduate. Interns assigned to the news department were supervised by Assistant News Director, Dave Grant. We had one intern interested in weather who was supervised by Meteorologist, Jay Prater, and one intern who worked in our Promotions Dept. under the supervision of Creative Services Director, John Sweeney. The interns' duties included observing various day-to-day activities in the newsroom, in the field, on the assignment desk, in the weather center, and in the promotions area. Each intern is assigned to shadow a position they would like to pursue, which includes reporters, news producers, photographers, meteorologists, and promotion producers. 2	Participate in events sponsored by community groups interested in broadcast employment issues.	KAKE-TV gave 11 station tours of the KAKE studio to area schools and community groups. The participants included students and individuals who were shown the different departments and jobs that work together to make the television station run smoothly. After the tours the participants were given time to ask questions about areas of interest and job opportunities in the various broadcasting positions at the station. Tables were set up for students to visit with organizations regarding internships and careers in the media and broadcasting industry. One of the students who stopped by the KAKE booth applied for a position in our Promotions Dept. and was later hired as a Commercial Media Producer.  2 - April 2, 2019 – KAKE Assistant News Director, Dave Grant, and Creative Services Director, John Sweeney, attended the Kansas Association of Broadcasters Student Seminar & Career Fair held at the University of Kansas and represented the News and Promotions Departments. The station personnel attending the job fair talked to students about their duties and responsibilities and informed students about internship and job opportunities available at KAKE. Dave volunteered his time to help students by critiquing tapes of the students who brought examples of their work to the fair.
5	Participate in events or programs sponsored by educational institutions relating to careers in broadcasting.	KAKE-TV hosted two students from area high schools and organizations for a Job Shadow Day. The students were able to watch employees at KAKE as they performed their day-to-day duties.  1. February 13, 2019 – A student from Eureka High School who is interested in a career in news broadcasting chose to do his job shadow day in the KAKE newsroom. He shadowed Photojournalist, Larry Buell, and Reporter, Lily Wu, as they put together a news story to be aired in the newscast later in the day.  2. April 24, 2019 – KAKE Reporter, Lily Wu, hosted a student from Andale High School who visited KAKE as part of their Junior Career Exploration Class. The student shadowed Lily as she interviewed someone for a news story and edited the story in the newsroom before it went on the air.

KAKE Management participated in five training sessions aimed at preventing discrimination and ensuring equal opportunity in the workplace:  1. firm of Foulston Siefkin in Wichita. The training focused on how to prevent, identify, and report harassment in the workplace. The presentation discussed sexual harassment, harassment based on protected categories (race, age, disability, and religion), e-harassment, and retaliation. An additional session was provided for managers to explain the steps of action to take when complaints are received.

- 2. October 31, 2019 KAKE Managing Editor, Ashley Oliver, attended the "Assertive Leadership Techniques" training session at Wichita State University's Center for Management Development. The program gave participants techniques to improve their assertiveness in leadership positions and how to have constructive confrontations in the workplace.

The webinar helps to ensure that employers are providing equal employment opportunities for their employees.
- 4. December 6, 2019 KAKE News Director, Anthony Maisel, and Chief Photojournalist, Nolan Roth, attended the "Improving Supervisory Skills" training session at Wichita State University's Center for Management Development. The training provided participants with ways to be a more effective leader and how to better train and manage employees in a supervisory role in the workplace.
- 5. December 11, 2029 KAKE Assistant News Director, Dave Grant, attended the "Leading Teams to High Performance" training session at Wichita State University's Center for Management Development. This session showed participants how to be effective leaders in the workplace by encouraging employees to do their best work, and how to critique and praise employees while earning their respect through leadership, mentoring, and guidance.
